The Great British Spring Clean - Cornwall Results

We'd like to say a huge thank you to everyone that took part in the Great British Spring Clean! Your registrations and hard work have undeniably benefitted Cornwall's environment and the state of its outdoor spaces. Here is the roundup of our statistics from the 15th - 31st March:

27 litter picks registered

246 volunteer registrations

161+ bags of litter collected



The Great British Spring Clean Totals 2024



425,626 bags pledged

The Great British Spring Clean is the nation's biggest mass-action environmental campaign that took place from 15 - 31 March. This year, an army of amazing #LitterHeroes pledged to pick more than 400,000 bags of litter. Together, we cleaned up the places and spaces we love, as Keep Britain Tidy celebrated its landmark 70th year of protecting the environment.

This year we spread the word that the environment belongs to everyone! Hundreds of thousands #LitterHeroes from many different communities are uniting to help tackle litter – some of which has been in our environment since we were founded 70 years ago.

Many volunteers regularly find 'retro rubbish' that was dropped many years ago but is still causing harm to our environment today, releasing greenhouse gases as it slowly breaks down in our soil and water, which contributes to the climate crisis.

The good news is that litter-picking is a simple action that anyone can do. It makes an immediate and visible difference to the environment where we live, work and play. In fact around 95% of people surveyed after 2023's campaign agreed they felt they had made a difference to their local area, and 91% said they felt part of a national movement that is taking action to tackle litter.

The Blue Litter Project

Updates from our latest marine litter collection campaign

On the 15th March we hosted the official launch event for the Blue Litter Project at the Exchange Gallery in Penzance. This event was a fantastic opportunity to bring together our growing network of environmentally conscious businesses and organisations to learn more about how we plan to tackle marine litter in Cornwall's remote areas. We showcased the selection of specialised litter picking equipment that we will be providing members of the marine leisure industry with over the course of the busy tourist season to help these groups collect and track litter as they encounter it. This project will help us to build a clearer picture of Cornwall's marine litter issue, and to showcase the marine leisure industry's willingness to protect and preserve the stunning natural spaces that it relies on.

What do I need to do to sign up?

Drop us an email at info@cleancornwall.org if you fit into any of these categories and would like to take part. Or give us a call at 07447818416. We can then discuss if your organisation would benefit from receiving some specialised litter picking equipment including:

- Reusable, waterproof litter collection bags
- Beach cleaning knives
- Large mesh litter collection bags
- Extra long litter pickers
- Compact litter pickers
- Telescopic poles with boat hook and keep net attachments
- PPE

We will then get you set up with the Blue Litter Project App that we have developed to track and trace litter in Cornwall marine spaces. It's simple and quick to use, and will provide us with valuable data about marine litter in Cornwall by identifying hotspots and commonly occurring types of litter.
